

Glen Osborne Committee Meeting Minutes February 3, 2026

Mark Brooks spoke first of completing the water system upgrade done in 2025 that is complete. The next project involves the system's piping, some of which dates back to the 1800s. Lines will be upgraded from Boundary Street down Beaver Rd to Glen Mitchell and up that road. Rabbit Hill and the upper part of Osborne Lane. Roads will be repaved where work is done. There are many connections to attend to. Sewickley Water services all adjoining boroughs, with Edgeworth being the toughest connection due to the height of their reservoirs and the resultant pressure issues. Work will mostly be done while school is out in the summer. There will be intermittent shutdown of water lines. There will also be new fire hydrants.

Jennifer Coyne introduced herself via telephone. Many council members remembered her from her presentation last year regarding the railroad quiet zone. Her family is a five-year resident of the borough. She knows the railroad industry operations and, specifically, Norfolk Southern. She plans to attend the Feb 17 Council Meeting.
